

Congratulations to all for your efforts to make Troop 19 so successful.


Volunteer Grants






were flashy. We had spirit, but we didn't blow anyone away with a cheer or chant, but we made up for it in encouragement.

This is it! Super Trip 2007. The theme is "GETTYSBURG!"

Troop 19 is returning once again to Gettysburg for the annual re enactment of the turning point of the Civil War. The troop will be leaving Huntersville on July 4 headed to New Market Battlefield State Historical Park and then on to Gettysburg College in Gettysburg, PA. On July 5, the troop will visit the Gettysburg National Military Park and tour the famous battle site and cemetery. On July 6, the re enactment begins with events starting at 8:30 AM up through the re enactment of the assault on the Union position upon Cemetery Ridge by the Confederate Forces at 6:00 PM. On July 7, the Troop will visit Appomattox Court House National Historic Park to visit the site of Lee's Surrender and the end of the Civil War in April 1865. The troop returns to Huntersville on July 8.

Again, the trip dates are July 4 - 9, 2007. Departure times will be published once a final count of attendees

are in. Costs are still being finalized but appear to be \$250 - 300 per person.
